MUSEUM AWARDED FEE-FOR-SERVICE AGREEMENT

The Museum is pleased to announce that the Cariboo Regional District via the Central Cariboo Arts and Culture Society has awarded the Museum of the Cariboo Chilcotin with a fee-for-service agreement of \$38,000.00 annually from 2020-2022 to assist with the Museum's operating expenses.
