Categories - choose one or more.

- 1. WORKING COWBOY - a cowboy who has spent most of his/her working years as a working cowboy or rancher, and is looked up to by his/her peers.
- 2. COMPETITIVE - a cowboy who has done well in cowboy sports and contributed to the betterment of rodeo or other horse sports.
- 3. PIONEER - a rancher who has spent many years developing a ranch.
- 4. HORSEMAN - a cowboy/rancher who, as part of his job, has turned out extra good ranch or rodeo horses.
- 5. ARTISTIC - a cowboy/rancher who was also a poet, artist, musician, writer, and/or craftsman.
- 6. FAMILY - members have been involved in cowboy activities for three or more generations.
- 7. CENTURY RANCHES - ranches that have been in the same family for 100 years or more.
- 8. BUILDER of WESTERN CULTURE – a person supportive and/or beneficial in the building of western culture.

1. Please ensure that you have confirmed your nominee is eligible prior to submitting a nomination form. To be inducted the nominee must:

- Have been a B.C. Resident for the majority of their life
- Accomplishments have been in B.C.
- Spent most of their working years as a working cowboy (all categories must meet this qualification)
- Majority of their income has been derived from working on a ranch, on a horse working with cattle, where this is the main income of the ranch
- For “Competitive” category: How did the person contribute to the betterment of rodeo or other horse sports? (Be prepared to list specific years, events, etc.)
- For “Century Ranch” category: has the ranch remained in the same family for 100 years?
- For “Artistic” category: Does this individual meet the requirements of being a cowboy **and** was also a poet, artist, musician, writer, or craftsman?

2. Please send in the following to assist the nomination review committee in making their decisions. Forms that are incomplete may be considered unacceptable and declined or held until more information is provided.

- Biography of the nominee including the following:
 - Birth year and place
 - Family information (a family tree can be very helpful!)
 - Work/Ranch/Family history – please include who they worked for and what years they worked there, what their responsibilities were. If “Competitive” category, ensure you include the years they rodeoed or showed horses etc.
- List of accomplishments, including the following:
 - Years of accomplishments
 - Contributions and/or previous awards
- High resolution photo of the nominee(s) (if successful we will contact you for more photos). If nominee selected, photo will be used in inductee announcements.

3. Ensure you have two people on the nomination form.

- Please have correct and up to date contact information for the nominee and nominators. Both the BC Cowboy Heritage Society and the Museum of the Cariboo Chilcotin will want to be in contact with you if your nomination is successful
